Born in 1973, **Vincent Gravé** has been drawing his whole life. Alongside his job as a teacher and illustrator, he displays his creative world in his various publications.

Little Bear, Tiny Little Bear




Big Bear, Little Bear

Little Bear and Big Bear do everything the same... or almost. They both have boots, a plate, a toothbrush, a bed... Just in different sizes.

They both drive a car, although Big Bear's is rather standard and Little Bear's is... Big Bear's back. They both sit on chairs, although Big Bear's is pretty traditional and Little Bear usually sits on Big Bear's knee... There is one difference though; Little Bear is not allowed coffee, but he has a cuddly toy, which Big Bear does not! A magnificent gentle and mischievous board book that cleverly and playfully explores comparisons and proportions.







Kintsugi the Bear is a bit arrogant. He is obsessed with his appearance, and one day, whilst parading around at the top of a mountain, he falls. He injures himself badly, which makes him look ugly, and feel very sad. How can he get better and become the bear with beautiful fur like before? Kaori, a little fairy from the village sees blood flowing down the river. Feeling brave, she sets off to find Kintsugi the bear, to heal his wounds. The bear in this story is named after Kintsugi, the Japanese art form of repairing broken pottery with lacquer dusted with powdered gold. Superbly illustrated, this picture book invites readers to help one another, but also to take care of living beings and things, repair and love them with their history and imperfections.







After studying comic art at the Liminka School of Arts. the Ecole Européenne Supérieure de l'Image (European School of Visual Arts) in Angoulême and the Malmö Serieskolan in Sweden, she travelled around Europe and published her stories in several comics and magazines, including C'est bon Antology (Sweden), NYT (Finland) and Kolor Klimax (Finland/USA). When she is not teaching comic art herself, she is working on new books with unpronounceable titles such as Sarjakuvantekijän opas (The Comic Book Author's Guide).


The Fox Race

At the back of the book, a leporello unfolds, presenting a map of Argentina and all the animals living there.



Here is a beautiful adaptation of Andersen's Ugly Duckling fairy tale: a monolog in seven acts.

I, a Duck is a cross between a picture book, a novel and a play. As the duckling grows, it finds its place - the duckling becomes a swan. This coming-of-age story favours emancipation over pity and challenges the established order. Instead of adopting a classic layout, the book alternates several pages of text with several pages of illustrations. Fanny Dreyer's illustrations – delicately audacious watercolours – abound with mysterious forms of nature, including grass, flowers, stones, as seen from the duckling's viewpoint. A poignant new voice for the Ugly Duckling.



Born in Pennsylvania in 1874. Gertrude Stein moved to France with her brother Léo in 1903. Both had a keen eye for art and became amongst the greatest patrons on the Parisian scene. Gertrude differentiated herself from her brother with a predilection for artistic radicalism, particularly Cubism. Her relationship with Alice B. Toklas marked a definite break from her brother. The gallery they ran together in their apartment on rue de Fleurus became a rendezvous for painters (Picasso, Matisse, Derain...). She also wrote a great deal, trying her hand at different genres, reinventing them in her own way with repetitions and groups of clauses that twisted the grammar. She died in Paris in 1946.



Alice Lorenzi lives and works in Liège, Belgium. She contributes to a number of anthologies and fanzines (Nos restes, Grandpapier, Mycose...) and published Les Heures de verre with La Cinquième Couche.
